




IMPROVE HEALTH, REDUCE COST URGENT CALL FOR THE REVISION OF THE TOBACCO DIRECTIVES

- Every year, more than 700,000 Europeans die due to tobacco consumption. That's the size of a city like Frankfurt or Krakow.
- In the EU, more than 1 in 4 (27%) cancers are attributable to tobacco consumption.












CONSUMPTION OF NEW PRODUCTS

Current State: Three Tobacco Control Directives Are Delayed at EC Level

Council Recommendation on Smoke & Aerosol Free Environments : Adopted on 3 Dec 2024
Tobacco Tax Directive: Delayed Since 2022
Tobacco Products Directive: 2 years behind the schedule
No Intention to Revise the Tobacco Advertising Directive 2003/33/EU
☐ No Intention to Work on Art. 32 of Horizontal Directive to Tackle a Cross-Border Shopping
☐ Weak Implementation of Art. 5.3 of the FCTC regarding tobacco lobbying

EU Members States (Council) Adopted a Recommendation on Smoke- & aerosol-free environments on 3 December 2024



- Only Greece and Germany abstained from voting; Germany cited political pressures despite supporting the proposal.
- Italy, Czechia, and Slovakia criticized the lack of an impact assessment and scientific evidence.

Support was voiced by countries including France, Latvia, Slovenia, Estonia, Spain, Poland, Netherlands, Ireland, Portugal, Romania, with varying levels of enthusiasm, emphasising alignment on the need for stronger tobacco control.

Alessandra Moretti, S&D negotiator on the resolution

- MEPs rejected a proposed resolution with 378 votes against and 152 in favour.
- Opposition came from multiple sides: some wanted stricter bans, while others defended personal freedoms and industry interests.







Tobacco Products & Advertising: Ordinary Legislative Procedure

- It takes on average 17 months to adopt a new directive
- Most of the directives are adopted in the 1st reading
- To revise tobacco control
 directives in 2028, they have to
 be released by DG SANTE at
 the latest in 2026

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
